



How to connect to Reclaimed Water?



Determine if you are in the Reclaimed Water Service Area, and evaluate if reclaimed water is right for you. Do you regularly water your lawn, wash your vehicles, flush your outboard motor, or have an aesthetic fountain?



If reclaimed water is right for you, simply call or visit any of the FKAA's customer service offices and let us know that you would like Reclaimed Water Service.

An educational and informative guide "Connecting to Reclaimed Water" is provided by the FKAA. This brochure is available at any of our customer service offices, or on our website at www.fkaa.com. Please submit a signed copy of the Guide prior to service being activated.



Once Reclaimed Water Service has been requested, an FKAA field representative will install a meter inside of the purple meter box, located at the edge of your property.



From the newly installed meter you may choose to simply install a locking hose bib dedicated to reclaimed water, or to plumb an irrigation system. Local building permits may be required.



In accordance with the Florida Department of Environmental Protection, residential customers must use either special lockable hose bibs or lockable vaults, service boxes or compartments for reclaimed water.

Additionally, all bibs, vaults, service boxes and compartments must be clearly labeled using the words "Do Not Drink", in English and Spanish, together with the equivalent standard international symbol. The FKAA has tags available for your convenience.



To better identify reclaimed water from potable water, and to aid in the prevention of cross connections, Pantone Purple is the recommended color for reclaimed water infrastructure.



After your system is connected, and you are ready for the reclaimed meter to be turned on, please contact the FKAA and let us know you are ready for your cross-connection inspection.

A field representative will visit your property to ensure proper connection to, and verify proper use of, reclaimed water. Inspections will continue annually.
